### Neighbor spends spare time on the track

Picture it: You're navigating a series of curves at high speed, dialed in with precision. Pushing it a

little harder on the straighter stretches, navigating around another driver and keeping an eye on one coming up behind. This isn't a Saturday afternoon on Veterans Parkway. This is neighbor Roger Johnson behind the wheel of a 376horsepower Porsche on one of the many circuit tracks he's visited across the country.

For him, there's a certain mental challenge involved in this hobby – both on and off t

this hobby - both on and off the track.

"I'm drawn to trying different things," Roger said. "I really like to learn and figure stuff out on my own."

Roger and other car, truck and motorcycle enthusiasts are invited to share their passion for

beautiful and powerful vehicles at a mini car show as part of the Sept. 13 FGNA Happy Hour Social.



The longtime Founders' Grove resident was first a

child growing up on the corner of Washington & Warner; now a father of two grown children who lives with his wife, Jen, on Grove Street.

The Johnsons left town for 25 years and came back in 2008, into a home just restored by the late, great David Beich. They love the neighborhood's diversity – the people, even the birds. "Growing up, I thought we had just blue jays, cardinals and robins," Roger said. "But the number of birds we really have just blows my mind."

#### **Racing roots**

In the 1980s, Roger was into motorcross. Later he learned to work on VW Beetles and restored a few. "2017 is when the track itch really started," he said, after friends gifted him a "Porsche track experience" in Atlanta.

Things sort of naturally progressed from there after Jen's brother was looking to get rid of a sports car. Turns out that 1986

Porsche was something a little special. It was originally owned by Tom Cruise, who bought it when filming "The Color of Money" with Paul Newman in Chicago in 1986 – just before "Top Gun."

Roger bought, restored and sold it during the pandemic. Then he acquired a gray 2012 911 Carrera S, and later a red 2015 911 GT3.

In 2021 he really got into what's called "High Performance Driver Education." Roger's driving takes place in a controlled environment – initially with an instructor in the passenger seat. There are defined rules, like for passing other cars. So Roger was able

to establish a comfort level over time. These days, even Jen gets behind the wheel sometimes.

Out on the track, Roger

is anticipating and reacting to all the things that could go wrong. "It is about the speed, but you also have to get the car braked to make the next turn," he said. "And sometimes you need to know how to just bail." ... As in, when you can't make a turn and have to hit the grass.

It's a stress you can kind of feed on, he says. And it has made him a much better driver on public roads, too.

### Fall Tree Planting Tips By Julie Murphy, FGNA resident & gardener

As summer begins to fade, residents of Founders' Grove await the show of brilliant color displayed courtesy of our neighborhood trees! Leaves change to gorgeous reds, oranges, yellows and even purples, making our daily walks even more enjoyable. Some of us may admire a tree or two and consider adding one to our home. Even though spring is thought of as prime planting time, fall is actually one of the best times of year to plant a tree:

- Cooler fall temperatures place less stress on a • newly planted tree than a tree planted in the spring, with incoming summer heat.
- Even though autumn rains tend to be less plentiful, they are beneficial to the newly planted tree. In cooler weather, the rate of water evaporation from leaves/stems is slower, providing less heat and water stress.
- is a time of slowing growth and putting resources into the root system. A well-established root system is critical to a tree's longevity.

When deciding on a tree for fall planting, keep in mind that a few trees are best planted in the spring, so check planting directions carefully for a tree you wish to plant. Also learn what types of disease, fungi, bugs, etc., are common for different trees so you can watch for any signs of trouble.

#### Steps to promote success if you plant this fall:

- 1. Choose the correct tree for the location. What type of soil is present at your chosen site? How much space do you have considering the tree's mature height and spread? How much sunlight will reach the tree each day? (Most trees require full to partial sun.) What types of characteristics are important to you in selecting a tree? Does the tree flower or fruit? What is the fall leaf color? Is there any winter interest?
- Call JULIE (811) before you dig. Illinois law requires calling for underground utility locations at least 2 working days prior to digging.

3. Dig a hole at least 2 times wider than the root ball – or 3 times if you are planting in compacted soil.



#### 4. Be sure the tree is **straight** once it is in the hole. Look at it from at least two vantage points to be certain the trunk is truly vertical.

- 5. Confirm the tree is planted at the proper **depth** by ensuring the root flare is visible above ground when the soil has been put in place. Water thoroughly.
- 6. Create a 2-3" mulch bed around the tree, keeping all mulch well away from the trunk of the tree to promote tree health.
- Spring is a time of growth for a tree, whereas fall 7. Water the tree daily for the first 1-2 weeks after planting and then every 2-3 days for the next 3-12 weeks or until the first freeze.


